Rhydlewis – Cllr. Ceri Jones reported that another large branch had fallen near to Hawen Hall. Also, Cllr. Jones reported that rubbish especially empty beer cans and bottles are being thrown from vehicles on the road down from Penrhiwpa to Rhydlewis, some of these ending up

in farmers fields which could cause damage to farm machinery and harm farm animals.

Coedybryn – Cllr. Emyr Jones again complained about the rubbish being thrown from vehicles.

Cllr. Maldwyn Lewis informed the meeting that due to the fatal accident on the main A478 road at Tanygroes last week, and traffic being diverted, he had received numerous telephone calls complaining about the speed of some vehicles driving through the rural villages. Cllr. Owenna Davies commented that she is working on arranging a petition for the villages and she would have this ready for the next meeting and as restrictions are now being eased, hopefully, the petition could be taken around the rural villages for speed restriction measures to be implemented.
